The EUROSTUDENT project

Organisation

- National Student Surveys based on an international core questionnaire
- 30 countries, some observers
- Funded by fees from participating countries (cofunded by ERASMUS+) and contributions from Germany and The Netherlands
- International Steering Board, including EU, ESU, and country representatives
- Consortium of 7 organisations (researchers, gov. agency, national statistics)





Share of students with a time delay of more than 24 months between leaving school and entering higher education (in %)





Representation of students without HE background


Based on fathers' educational attainment

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Composition of students' income only students not living with parents




Total monthly income including transfers in kind Source of income (in %)

Extent of current financial difficulties of all students Share of students (in %)






Mobility within EUROSTUDENT

- We survey students not graduates
 → no "real" mobility rate!
- We focus on barriers not on ratios
- We distinguish
 - Students with study related experience abroad
 - Students who plan to be mobile
 - Students who have not been and do not plan to be mobile
- We cover
 - Enrolment
 - Internship
 - Other (summer school, research, language course)

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


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
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Primary source of funding (those who have been)
