

Networking Vocational Education and Business: A Contact Making Seminar for Erasmus+

13-15 OCTOBER 2015

What is a TCA seminar?

This TCA (Transnational Cooperation Activity) event organised by **the Agency for Mobility and EU Programmes**, the Croatian National Agency for implementation of Erasmus+ programme, is a contact making seminar with the aim of **enhancing networking opportunities between business sector and VET (vocational education and training) sector** among countries which participate in Erasmus+ programme. This contact seminar is co-organised by the National agencies from the following countries: **Finland, Germany, Italy, Island, Slovenia and Sweden.**

What is the aim of this seminar?

The objective of this seminar is to enhance cooperation between business and educational sector within the following VET fields: **health, tourism&catering and environmental technologies.** The aim of the seminar is to bring different stakeholders from the business and VET sector together in order to develop **Erasmus+ mobility (KA1) and partnership (KA2) projects** in the VET field.

The **specific goals** of this contact seminar are to:

- enhance networking between business and VET sectors
- promote future cooperation between world of work and VET field
- establish stable partnerships for future transnational activities.

The participants of this seminar will have the opportunity to:

- find partners for future Erasmus+ projects
- learn more about Erasmus+ possibilities to apply with project proposals
- find out more about state of the art in the 3 VET sectors across Europe
- experience best practice examples first hand
- do a workshop on developing project ideas

Who can participate?

We have envisaged a small-scale seminar with a limit of **50 participants** in total, primarily coming from the co-organising countries **Croatia, Finland, Germany, Italy, Island, Slovenia and Sweden**. We invite relevant participants in the VET fields - **health, tourism & catering and environmental technologies** coming from the following organisations:

- enterprises
- employers who facilitate training at the work place
- vocational education schools/centres,
- research institutions
- relevant social partners.

What is the working language?

Working language of this seminar is **English**.

How much do I have to pay?

The participation fee in this contact seminar is **50,00 EUR** per participant. The selected participants will receive an invoice and will be kindly asked to pay the contact seminar fee before the seminar starts. The participants will have to cover their own trip. All other costs (seminar materials, accommodation and board for 2 nights) will be covered by the hosting Croatian NA.

The **Neptun Hotel****** is the tallest hotel in the city of Dubrovnik. It is situated on the Lapad Peninsula in the village of Babin Kuk and only 4 kilometres from the city of Dubrovnik (Old Town).
